Corporate Statement of SB657 California Transparency in Supply Chains Act of 2010

At International Vitamin Corporation (IVC), we are committed to respecting human rights and conducting business under the highest ethical standards. IVC expects their suppliers to conduct their business using these same values.

IVC regularly reviews and assesses potential risks of current and potential suppliers. To date, based on the assessments of the risk posed by our suppliers, we have not required the services of a third party to verify our internal risk assessments.

IVC's policy is to only do business with suppliers that comply with all laws, rules, and regulations, including those laws related to slavery and human trafficking. We expect our suppliers to represent and warrant that all materials, components and finished product provided to IVC were produced or provided in full compliance with the laws regarding slavery and human trafficking at the location of production.

IVC reserves the right to have an internal employee or third party inspect all facilities where materials, components and finished product are produced, including for compliance with international, national, local, federal and state laws. These inspections may include independent and unannounced audits. IVC also reserves the right to terminate any purchase order for any reason, including failure to comply with international, national, local, federal and state laws. In the future IVC may require or perform independent, unannounced audits of suppliers to specifically review compliance with company standards on trafficking and slavery.
